Public Health Core Certificate

LPHI is proud to offer the Public Health Core Certificate to students able to show mastery of public health core requirements. To earn this certificate, a student must complete a designated set of *On Your Time* modules within five years of application and achieve a passing score of 90% on each module. This certificate is recommended for staff and board members of LBOH and health departments who may be new to the field, may lack formal public health education, or may simply want to refresh their knowledge. 
2016 LPHI Fellows


