This workshop establishes a foundational understanding of how race-based structural inequities impact school health access and outcomes. This foundation provides learners with basic tools to refine practice and management systems to create more inclusive, safe and effective student experiences in health offices and across school campuses. With its focus on equity and diverse populations, this course enables educators to meet ESL (RETELL) professional development requirements in accordance with 603 CMR 44.06(1)(a).

- Demonstrate how structural racism manifests itself in communities and schools
- Connect communities and schools to the larger reality of racial inequity in the U.S.
- Through self-reflection, understand how explicit and implicit racism affects school health practice and brainstorm steps leaders can take to create safe and inclusive spaces within their offices and schools
