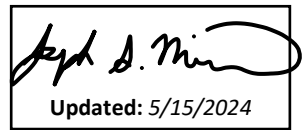

- Collaborated with administrators in the Dean of Students Office to institutionalize the organization, including securing institutional funding and staffing resources

- Since its founding in 2013, the organization has identified at least three at-risk students and successfully connected them with higher-level mental health resources
