- Faculty/resident mentorship and networking
- \$500 stipend and funds available to offset the cost of housing

Child health disparities may be addressed by improving the number of URM academic pediatricians. The Minority Senior Scholarship Program (MSSP) program aims to expose URM medical students to careers in academic pediatrics.

WHERE?

Our world-class pediatric residency program recruits 40 new residents each year and is known nationally as an innovator in pediatric medical education.
