BU Consortium educators who make an appointment to visit *can* access subscription digital resources *within our libraries* and can also apply for **Book Borrowing Privileges** as well.

To make an appointment to visit campus please contact the Head of Pickering Library listed below.

The process for applying for **Book Borrowing Privileges** is as follows:

- Educators who work in BU Consortium districts can acquire an application from the librarian named below.
- The application should bear the signature of the school administrator who will be the contact person in the event that fines are accrued and unpaid by the borrower. It is understood that the borrower or the school or school district will be responsible for fines accrued for overdue or unreturned materials.
- Once Pickering Library staff approves the application, we will notify the educator.
- When onsite within the Mugar Library or its branches, the educator must present photo identification.
- A new application must be filed each school year when the educator wishes to borrow materials.

Educators who work in BU Consortium school districts may access many of BU's online resources if they come to campus for a consultation. No off-campus use of subscription resources can be offered, but BU Libraries Search is free to use, and research literature is becoming more open access. We look forward to welcoming you to the BU Libraries.
