## Annual Keynote Lecture

The Annual Keynote Lecture is an opportunity for the community to learn from leaders about critical issues in early childhood well-being. In November 2023, the Keynote Speaker was Marica Cox Mitchell, Vice President of Ealy Childhood at Bainum Family Foundation. She gave an enlightening lecture about workforce development in early childhood. Her lecture was followed by a panel discussion with the Commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Early Childhood, Director of Boston's Office of Early Childhood, Senior Director of Family Child Care, Nurtury Early Education, and an Early Childhood Educator.



## Early Childhood Well-Being Research Connections Event

This year the EC Institute inaugurated the Early Childhood Well-Being Research Connections Event. This event allows researchers from all disciplines interested in early childhood to learn about each others' research, network, and possibly make connections that lead to research collaborations. In April 2024, we had a group of six flash talks that included research funded by the Institute for Early Childhood Well-Being and other research conducted by EC Institute researchers. These were followed by discussion groups and a reception. The event was so well-received that it will become a yearly event.




