The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act to affecting municipal rights regarding medical marijuana.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any law or special law to the contrary, cities, towns,
- districts, school districts or regional school districts may regulate, including prohibiting, the use
- 3 of marijuana, including medical use of marijuana used for medicinal purposes. Prohibition of the
- 4 use of or smoking marijuana, including medical use of marijuana on public property, shall not be
- 5 deemed to be discrimination due to a medical condition under the laws of the commonwealth.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
