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**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act creating a pilot program to discourage drinking by individuals under the legal drinking age and to provide a non-criminal disposition process for first offenders, including alcohol education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 PREAMBLE

2 The General Court finds that chapter 138 of the General Laws governs offenses relating
3 to alcohol offenses by individuals under the age of 21 and that many such offenders are not
4 aware of the serious issues which may arise from the use and abuse of alcohol. Therefore, the
5 General Court is establishing a pilot program designed to provide a new method of dealing with
6 individuals under the age of 21 who could otherwise be charged criminally with violations of
7 chapter 138. The General Court states that the purpose of the program is to provide education to
8 individuals under the legal drinking age who have been charged for the first time with violating

9 laws relating to procurement, possession or use of alcoholic beverages. The General Court has
10 determined that the program shall only be applicable to first time violators under the age of 21
11 who have not previously been convicted under chapter 138 of an offense involving alcohol. The
12 program shall not limit the ability of the court to impose additional penalties upon or require
13 restitution from those program participants who have also been charged with a separate crime for
14 causing personal injury or personal or real property damage during the commission of any
15 offense under sections 34 through 34D, inclusive.

16 SECTION 1. Chapter 138 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
17 following 2 sections:-

18 Section 34E. (a) There shall be established within the commonwealth a pilot program for
19 a period of three years from the effective date of this section to study the effectiveness of
20 mandatory alcohol education programs on individuals under the age of 21, subject to the
21 exception identified below in subsection (b), who have been charged with first-time violations of
22 sections 34 through 34D, inclusive, of this chapter.

23 (b) Any individual under the age of 21 who is charged, for the first time, with a violation
24 of any provision of section 34 to 34D, inclusive, subsequent to the effective date of this section
25 shall have said charges treated as a non-criminal matter under the pilot program. If such
26 individual under the age of 21 is also charged with and found to have caused personal injury or
27 personal or real property damage during the commission of a violation under section 34 to 34D,
28 inclusive, the court shall retain the authority to impose additional penalties or require restitution
29 for such injury or damage in accordance with the applicable law; provided, further, that an

30 individual under the age of 21 convicted of any offense under section 34 to 34D, inclusive, prior
31 to the effective date of this section shall not be eligible for participation in said program.

32 (c) Any violations of section 34 to 34D arising from a single event shall be considered
33 part of the first-time non-criminal matter, hereinafter a “first time offender event”. Violations
34 arising from the same event other than those under this chapter shall be treated separately under
35 the applicable statutes.

36 (d) The police officer shall give to such first time offender at the time and place of the
37 offense, a written notice to appear before the clerk of the district court having jurisdiction thereof
38 at any time during office hours, not later than 21 days after the date of such notice. Such written
39 notice shall be in triplicate and shall contain the name and address, if known, of the offender, the
40 specific offense charged, and the time and place for his required appearance. Such notice shall be
41 signed by the police officer and shall be signed by the offender whenever practicable in
42 acknowledgment that such notice has been received.

43 If it is not possible to deliver a copy of said notice to the offender at the time and place of
44 the offense, the copy shall be mailed by first class mail, or delivered by the police officer, or by
45 his commanding officer or by any person authorized by such commanding officer, to the
46 offender's last known address, within 15 days after said violation. The notice as so mailed shall
47 be deemed a sufficient notice, and a certificate of the person so mailing such notice that it has
48 been mailed in accordance with this section shall be prima facie evidence thereof.

49 At or before the completion of each tour of duty, or at the beginning of the first
50 subsequent tour of duty, the police officer shall give to his commanding officer a copy of each
51 notice of an offense he has taken cognizance of during such tour which has not already been

52 delivered or mailed by him as aforesaid. The commanding officer shall retain and safely preserve
53 1 copy and shall, at a time not later than the next court day after such delivery or mailing, deliver
54 the other copy to the clerk of the court before which the offender has been notified to appear.
55 The clerk of each district court shall maintain a separate docket of such notices to appear.

56 The chief of police in each city or town shall direct the department's liquor enforcement
57 officer or another appropriate member of the police department to act as a liaison between the
58 department and the clerk's office of the district court having jurisdiction of such offenses.

59 (e) In addition to the notice requirement provided above, an additional copy of the
60 violation notice mailed or delivered to a person under the age of 18 shall be mailed or delivered
61 to at least 1 parent or legal guardian of the person. Whenever practicable, department shall also
62 be responsible for making a telephone call to a parent or legal guardian of a person under the age
63 of 18 for the purpose of notification.

64 (f) Any person notified to appear before the clerk of a district court as provided may so
65 appear and make an admission of having violated one of the provisions of section 34 to 34D as
66 charged. Said admission may be given personally or through a duly authorized agent. This shall
67 not be deemed a criminal proceeding. Upon appearance and admission to the section 34 to 34D
68 offense charged, the individual under the age of 21 shall pay into the fund established in section
69 34F, a fine of \$300 for each such separately identified violation of sections 34 to 34D included in
70 the first-time offender event and he shall agree to attend an approved alcohol awareness program
71 as described below. For any first-time violation of section 34A or 34C, the court shall report the
72 same to the registrar of motor vehicles and the offender's license or right to operate a motor
73 vehicle shall be suspended as provided in the applicable section.

74 If any person so notified to appear desires to contest the section 34 to 34D offense alleged
75 in the notice to appear and also to avail himself of the procedure established pursuant to this
76 paragraph, he may, within 21 days after the date of the notice, request a hearing in writing. Such
77 hearing shall be held before a district court judge, clerk, or assistant clerk, as the court shall
78 direct, and if the judge, clerk, or assistant clerk shall, after hearing, find that the section 34 to
79 34D offense occurred and that it was committed by the person so notified to appear, the person
80 so notified shall be permitted to a disposition of the case by paying into the fund established in
81 section 34F a fine of \$300 for each such section 34 to 34D offense included in the first-time
82 offender event and he shall attend an approved alcohol awareness program as set forth in this
83 section. For any first-time violation of section 34A or 34C, the court shall report the same to the
84 registrar of motor vehicles and the offender's license or right to operate a motor vehicle shall be
85 suspended as provided in the applicable section. Any proceeding held under this paragraph shall
86 not be deemed a criminal proceeding.

87 If the judge, clerk, or assistant clerk shall, after a hearing, find that the section 34 to 34D
88 offense alleged did not occur or was not committed by the person notified to appear, that finding
89 shall be entered in the docket, which shall operate as a final disposition of the case. Any
90 proceeding held under this paragraph shall not be deemed to be a criminal proceeding.

91 (g) The alcohol awareness program must provide at least 4 hours of classroom instruction
92 and 1 hour of group discussion; provided, further, that said program shall also require 10 hours
93 of community service. The subject matter of any such alcohol awareness program shall be
94 specific to the use and abuse of alcohol with particular emphasis on early detection and
95 prevention of alcohol abuse. Such program must also incorporate a component specifically
96 addressing the issue of alcohol use by individuals under the age of 21 and the particular pressures

97 exerted on such individuals with respect to alcohol. Notice of completion of the alcohol
98 awareness program by each participant shall be provided in writing by the approved program to
99 the court.

100 (h) Any alcohol awareness program in which an individual wishes to complete his
101 required attendance must be included on a list to be established and approved by the state bureau
102 of educational services within the department of youth services or any successor to said bureau.

103 (i) Any fines assessed under subsection (f) shall be paid within 2 months of the date of
104 admission or finding; provided, further, that attendance at the required alcohol awareness
105 program shall be completed within 1 year of the date of the admission or finding.

106 (j) If the individual under the age of 21 completes the alcohol awareness program and
107 pays the fine as provided in subsection (f) within the time period set forth in subsection (i), those
108 offenses shall not become part of the individual's criminal record. However, records shall be
109 maintained separately by the criminal history systems board showing the name, address, section
110 34 to 34D offense and age at the time of offense of each individual who has participated in the
111 pilot program and has successfully completed it. Such records shall be available to police
112 departments and courts for the purpose of determining eligibility to participate in the pilot
113 program. Such records shall also be available to police departments and courts for the purpose of
114 charging subsequent violations of section 34 to 34D by the same individuals as second or
115 subsequent offenses under said sections; or charging individuals as second or subsequent
116 offenders under any other provisions of the General Laws which would otherwise treat the first-
117 time offenses under section 34-34D as the first offense in a statute which imposes greater
118 penalties for second and subsequent offenses.

119 (k) An admission by an individual under the age of 18 or a finding of a violation of a
120 section 34 to 34D offense may be considered factually in a CHINS petition against an individual
121 subject to such petition under sections 21 to 51H of chapter 119 or any other federal or state
122 statute relating to children in need of services.

123 (l) Upon the failure of a person under the age of 21 to pay the required fines and complete
124 the alcohol awareness program, the registrar of motor vehicles shall suspend the offender's
125 license or permit to operate for 180 days. This suspension shall be separate from any suspension
126 set forth in this section for a violation of sections 34A or 34C.

127 Section 34F. There is hereby established a Alcohol Awareness Education Fund,
128 hereinafter “the Fund”. One hundred dollars of any first-time section 34 to 34D fine imposed
129 against an individual under the age of 21 pursuant to the pilot program established in section 34E
130 shall be deposited into this fund with the remainder deposited into the General Fund. Each such
131 section 34 to 34D fine imposed for a separate violation of any provision any of those sections
132 shall be considered a separate fine. Monies accumulated in the Fund shall be made available by
133 the department of public safety and security in the form of grants to municipal police
134 departments to aid in the development of additional programs in the public schools and to
135 address the issues of alcohol use and abuse prevention.

136 SECTION 2. Six months prior to the end of the third year of the pilot program, each
137 police department within the commonwealth shall provide to the General Court a report on the
138 effectiveness of the pilot program, including the number of participants and the recidivism rate
139 for those persons under the age of 21 who have participated therein. The General Court shall

140 then determine whether such pilot program should be extended. If the General Court does not so
141 extend the pilot program, said program shall automatically terminate at the end of the third year.
