I am honored to have been chosen for this important responsibility and sincerely regret that I will not be able to serve in this capacity.

As you are no doubt aware, the Legislature is currently working to meet a June 30 deadline to reconcile both the marijuana policy legislation and the FY18 budget. I am fortunate enough to have been nominated to serve on the conference committee for both. Unfortunately the time requirements for both of these committees would not allow me to give either one the attention it deserves. On a personal note, my youngest daughter is getting married this weekend placing even more constraints on my time. Because of this happy occasion, I will be unavailable both June 30 and July 1.

With these concerns in mind and my sincere apology, I ask that I please be removed from the conference committee for S2090 and H3776. Thank you for your consideration.

### Emergency Preamble Adopted.

An engrossed Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Paul Geraghty, an employee of the Trial Court of the Commonwealth (see House, No. 905, amended), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,— was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.
