A Bill further regulating the membership of the board of trustees of the Woburn Public Library Corporation (House, No. 3820,-- on petition) [Local approval received],-- was read and, under Senate Rule 26, placed in the Orders of the Day for the next session.

Message from His Excellency the Governor (pursuant to Article II, Section 8 of Article LXXXIX of the Amendments to the Constitution) recommending legislation ratifying the town meeting of the town of Rowley (Senate, No. 2550) (received in the office of the Clerk of the Senate on Thursday, October 7, 2021, at five o'clock P.M.);

Rowley,-- town meeting.

The message was read; and, under Senate Rule 20, with the accompanying bill, was referred to the committee on Election Laws.

Sent to the House for concurrence.

PAPERS FROM THE HOUSE.

The Senate Bill upgrading hen welfare and establishing uniform cage-free standards (Senate, No. 2481),-- came from the House passed to be engrossed, in concurrence *with an amendment* striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text of House document numbered 4194; by inserting before the enacting clause the following emergency preamble:

Hen welfare.

“Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to ensure hen welfare and establish uniform cage-free standards, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.”; and by striking out the title and inserting in place thereof the following title: “An Act further regulating hen welfare and establishing uniform cage-free standards”.

**Mr. Tarr moved that the Senate NON-concur in the House amendments and asked for a committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two branches; and Senators Lewis, Rausch and Tarr were appointed to the committee on the part of the Senate.**

**The bill was returned to the House endorsed accordingly.**

Petitions were severally referred, in concurrence, as follows, to wit:

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4203) of Dylan A. Fernandes and Julian Cyr (by vote of the town) that the town of Nantucket be authorized to designate the Nantucket Housing Authority as the agency authorized to create, administer and enforce housing needs covenants in said town;

Nantucket,-- housing needs.

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4202) of Joan Meschino and others relative to waivers for non-fault overpayments of certain unemployment insurance benefits;

Unemployment insurance,-- waivers.

**Under suspension of Joint Rule 12, to the committee on Labor and Workforce Development.**

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4201) of Dylan A. Fernandes and Julian Cyr (by vote of the town) relative to authorizing the town of Nantucket to impose a real estate transfer fee for affordable and workforce housing;

Nantucket,-- affordable housing.
