- Providing additional oversight and use of the Renewable Energy Trust by the Secretary of Energy and Environmental Affairs.
- Increasing the Attorney General's ability to act on behalf of energy customers.
- Promoting the use of energy efficient vehicles in the state's fleet.
- Extending low interest loans for energy efficient home improvements.
