Summary of Proposed Law:

This legislation would authorize pharmacists to engage in voluntary collaborative drug therapy management practice under the supervision and direction of a physician.

"Collaborative drug therapy management" is defined as the initiating, monitoring, modifying, and discontinuing of a patient's drug therapy, by a pharmacist in accordance with a collaborative practice agreement.

In order to enter into a collaborative practice agreement, the pharmacist must meet certain license, insurance, and educational requirements.

Collaborative practice agreements shall only be allowed in certain settings.

The Department of Public Health shall promulgate regulations and review them two years thereafter.
