

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE.

Engrossed Bill.

Bill laid before Governor.

An engrossed Bill designating a certain structure in the town of Salisbury as the Paul H. Sullivan Sun Shade Deck (see House, No. 714) (which originated in the House), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and signed by the Acting President (Mr. Rosenberg) and laid before the Governor for his approbation.

Orders of the Day.

The Senate Bill providing for the uniform prudent management of institutional funds (Senate, No. 2078, amended),— was read a third time.

The Senator from Norfolk, Bristol and Middlesex, Mr. Brown, then led the Chair (Mr. Rosenberg), members, guests and employees in the recitation of the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Reports of a Committee.

By Mr. Panagiotakos, for the committee on Ways and Means, that the Senate Bill providing for the uniform prudent management of institutional funds (Senate, No. 2078),-- ought to pass, with an amendment striking out the text of section 8 and inserting in place thereof the following:-

"This chapter modifies, limits, and supersedes the electronic signatures in global and national commerce act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7001 et seq., but does not modify, limit, or supersede Section 101(c) of that act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7001(c), or authorize electronic delivery of any of the notices described in Section 103 of that act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7003(b)."

There being no objection, the rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Brown, and the bill was read a second time and was amended, as recommended by the committee on Ways and Means.

The bill (Senate, No. 2078, amended) was then ordered to a third reading.

On June 10, 2009 the Senate Ways and Means Committee recommended S. 2078 ought to be adopted with the following amendment:

“This chapter modifies, limits, and supersedes the electronic signatures in global and national commerce act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7001 et seq., but does not modify, limit, or supersede Section 101(c) of that act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7001(c), or authorize electronic delivery of any of the notices described in Section 103 of that act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7003(b).”

The Uniform Law Commission, which wrote the language of this uniform bill, realized an error in the original draft, which is corrected by this amendment.

Wednesday, June 10, 2009: State House News Senate Session Reporting

FUNDS MANAGEMENT: S 2078 an act providing for the uniform prudent management of institutional funds, was reported to the floor from the Ways and Means Committee with an amendment. The amendment was adopted and the bill ordered to third reading.
