

Surplus property.

By Mr. Cabral of New Bedford, for the committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight, asking to be discharged from further consideration of the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3770) of David L. Flynn and others relative to further regulating the development of underused state-owned real property and the disposition of state-owned surplus real property, — and recommending that the same be referred to the committee on Bonding, Capital Expenditures and State Assets.
