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Senator Creem's Office (Original sponsor of the Bill)	Contacted Senator Creem's office and spoke with Catherine Anderson. After I explained the project to her, she indicated that the materials would be in a box and that she would have to search for it. I sent her a follow up email. We have emailed back and forth a few times. I was able to obtain quite a few documents from her files.
House Committee on Children, Families, and Persons with Disabilities	Spoke with Ernestina. She said they purge their files after each session but that I could come by and copy whatever they did have. I made copies of the information that was relevant from the hearing files.
Senate Committee on Children, Families, and Persons with Disabilities (Senator Spilka's Office)	I spoke with Erin Bradley, policy analyst. Charles Glick, Charles Group Consulting	Charles Group Consulting worked to change the bill. Mr. Glick provided me with access to his electronic and hard copy files. There was some additional material that did not seem relevant to the technical aspects to the bill.
