Foode Heerebaa Daraame, founder of the village of Suunaa-Karantabaa has descendants. His first son's name is Samba Jaakumbaa followed by Foode Jaakumbaa, Kumba Tunkara, and Sumaare Kumba Daabo respectively. He had three wives: Neemuna Jaakumbaa, Eesaa Tunkara, and Jaakumbaa Baroo. The descendants of Jaakumba consist of the families of Kaŋ Maaliki, Kaŋ Foode Jaane, and the lineage of imams. The descendants of Eesaa Tunkara consist of the family of Seeni of the village of Kanlaaji and the family of Kaŋ Siisaawo. The descendants of Sumaare Kumbaa Daabo consist of Kaŋ Foode Santama Kasama. 1) The *Suunaa-Karantabaa mosque* was built in honor of Foode Heerebaa Daraame who hailed from the village of Jaasiŋ-Karantabaa, a village located between Lenketo and Tabana. From Jaasiŋ-Karantabaa, he first relocated to Bamba-Joŋ. From there, he went to establish the village of Karantabaa with his nephew, Janko along with his disciples. There, they built a small mosque. Foode Heerebaa spent 15 years. He built this monument in honor of grandfathers, his fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God, the Almighty, bestow blessings on him in honor of the land of Pakaawu.

On his turn, Sumaare Kumba Daabo built the mosque of Suunaa-Karantabaa in honor of Foode Jaane Jakoŋ whose father was named Ibrahimia Wudee. He devoted all his efforts to honor his mother, his father, and his Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu.

2) The *Kunkali mosque* was built to honor Foode Jaane Daabo. The village of Kunkali was built by Foode Tumaŋ Kale Maariyaa and Foode Tumani Haa Jaane in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. 3) The *Sonkoduu-Janna mosque* was built

Ismayila Kommaa and Bukaa Sidii Suwaane established the village at the home of Foode Ibrahiima Jeebaate who led the holy war in honor of their mothers, fathers, Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. 6) The *Jaasiŋ-Salikeñe* mosque was built to honor Foode Siisaawo Jalima. Ibrahiima Baa Heera established the village in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers.

May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. 10) The *Bayambaa mosque* was built to honor Foode Iraamaŋ Daraame.

May God answer our prayers in honor Pakaawu. 12) The *Baasaafu mosque* was built to honor Foode Saalum Daraame. The village of Baasaafu was established by Foode Seesuuna Ñaaliŋ and his nephew, Saalum Daabo. They hailed from Daraame-kunda Sibookoto (a neighborhood in Jaasiŋ-Njama). They established the village in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. 13) The *Babaadi mosque* was built to honor Foode Bala Kunjii Siise. The village was established by Foode Sanuusii, Foode Maadiŋ, and Foode Mandinka.

They built the mosque in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May our prayers be answered in honor of Pakaawu. 14) The *Daarusalaami mosque* was built to honor Foode Iburaahiima Dafe. Kariimu Ishaaka left Suunaa-Karantabaa, and established Daarusalaami in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. It was there that Sillaa Baa led the holy war. 15) The *Siitaba mosque* was built to honor Foode Muhammadu Jaa Daraame. Muhammadu Almata Bajinka with five men left Kubooni and

went to establish Siitaba in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. 16) The *Badunaa mosque* was built to honor Foode Laamini Kaayi. Janko and Biraŋ left Bamba-Joŋ and went to establish the village of *Badunaa* in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers

in honor of Pakaawu. 17) The *Sumbundu mosque* was built to honor Foode Muusaa Siimaa. Mankoto Kamara and his relative, Buraŋ Kamara, left Ñaani with Alaaji Kamara who left Korobaali-Juulaaduu to establish the village of Sumbundu in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. 18) The *Mankonombaa mosque* was built to honor Foode Jaa Alimaami Daraame. Foode Baakari Jaawo and his nephew Siise left Kantuure to establish the village in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor of Pakaawu. 19) The *Wudukaari mosque* was built to honor Foode Bamba Foofanaa. Bambi Kamara left Ñaani, while Foode Kuli Silla and Foode Baakari Silla left Jaamun, together they establish the village in honor of their mothers, fathers, and Quranic teachers. May God answer our prayers in honor Pakaawu.

Pakaawu. 23) The *Sandiyeeri mosque* was built to honor Foode Tumaani Seyni Daraame. Suwaane Keemoo and his daughter Jilaŋ Saari,
