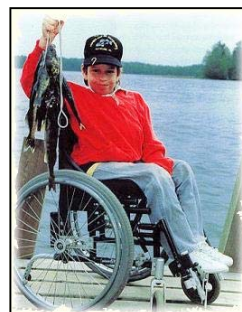


Are you a young adult, teen, or with a developmental disability?

We want your opinion



Usually doctors, teachers, therapists, and other adults like parents answer questions about what youth with disabilities can and can't do. But youth may feel differently than their parents or professionals. It is important to find out what youth with disabilities think.

We are looking for young adults, teens, and kids ages 8-21 with developmental disabilities such as cerebral palsy, autism, or intellectual disability to practice taking a self-report and participate in an interview.

During the interview, youth with disabilities will practice answering questions about activities like taking care of yourself, spending time with friends, or working at a job.

Youth will give their opinion... do you like our questions? Are the questions easy to understand and answer? How did you choose your answers? Your opinions will help us make a new questionnaire that is made just for youth and young adults with developmental disabilities.

The interview will take up to three hours and can be finished in one or two meetings. We will help to make sure the interview is not too hard. When the interview is over, youth will receive a \$15.00 gift certificate.
